Have You Heard? Faith Lutheran Church of Great Falls, Montana is Taking on God's Journey—Where the True Word of the Bible is heard— Where will God's Journey Take Them?

Tears mingled with prayers and song Sunday in the pews of Great Falls Faith Lutheran Church as congregation members; some of whom have worshiped in the building for more than six decades; held their last weekly service before forfeiting the church in a schism over gay clergy.

After Faith Lutheran's parent body, the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA), began ordaining men and women in same-sex relationships as ministers in 2009, a 71 percent majority of the Great Falls church's congregation voted to disaffiliate in protest.

The remaining 29 percent of the church membership reconstituted as New Hope Lutheran Ministry and ultimately sued for control of church property on the basis that the church constitution required a 90 percent vote for a disaffiliating group to retain control of church assets.

The suit came to an end March 12, when the Montana Supreme Court ruled in partial favor of the New Hope minority, which remains associated with the ELCA. The Faith Lutheran majority will be forced to relinquish the church building at 3125 5th Ave. S., but will maintain control of assets held in trust by the church foundation.

As the legal process wore on, the conservative majority continued holding services in their traditional building. With the suit resolved, however, they found themselves facing their final worship service in the space.

Cars filled the parking lots and lined snowy neighborhood streets Sunday as a full sanctuary listened to the Rev. Ken Waag, the church's senior pastor for the past two decades, deliver a sermon that one attendee likened to a memorial service.

"We're all leaving something behind," Pastor Waag told his congregation. "This is not an easy thing for us to do."

"God is with us," he said. "Good things sometimes come to an end so that something better can take place."

"There is no room on this journey for bitterness," he added.

After a final hymn ; "On Our Way Rejoicing" Pastor Waag spoke briefly with each member of the congregation as they filed out of the sanctuary, offering hugs and handshakes and reassurances.

"We wanted to remain faithful to the time-honored teaching of scripture and to the authority of God's Word," he said after the service.

"This truly is a grand adventure for us," he said. "I'm excited to see what God is going to do next."

"We've never been more united," he added. "There's just such a great spirit here at Faith Lutheran."

Church members expressed a similar bittersweet optimism.

"Our name is 'Faith,'" said Sandra Goff, a church council member. "That's how we're going forward."

"I cried through the whole service," added Goff, who has spent 42 years involved with the church. "I could hardly sing."

"The Bible says 'If you follow Him you will be persecuted,'" she said. "We are smiling through our tears."

One newer church member, Jo Shauer, said that she and her husband had moved to Faith Lutheran after the schism. "It was very important for us to come over here and live the scripture," she said.

Galia Fundis, another longtime Faith Lutheran member, said that she'd been part of the church since being married there 31 years ago.

"It's been in the family for a very long time," said Fundis, adding that, between her and her husband, she's raised seven kids in the church.

Still, she said, "This church is just a building; the congregation is the real church."

As the New Hope ministry takes up residence at the church building, the majority congregation said they plan to begin holding services at the Columbus Center.
