Is the Annual Gathering Worth Attending? More than You Can Imagine!

uring the Annual Gathering in Des Moines last fall, our group from two Montana churches was sitting at a table awaiting dinner. Mike Violett's wife, Suzie, did not feel well and stayed in her room, so we had an empty seat at our table. It was no accident!

I love lots of cream in my coffee so I got up to borrow more from an unoccupied table toward the back. Two men came walking toward me. I recognized one as an LCMC staffer, who asked, "Do you mind if this gentleman sits with you?" I said, "Of course not," and was introduced to Rev. Jordan Long from the South Sudan.

I introduced Rev. Long to the others at our table, and told him we were all from Montana. We informed him that as of that moment he was a Montanan too. We laughed together.

We had a great meal and conversation during which God was at work. And God kept working. Members of our group bumped into Rev. Long at various times during the Gathering and talked. Some attended Rev. Long's breakout session. Together and separately we were all thinking about Rev. Long, talking about Rev. Long, talking with Rev. Long and praying for him.

We seemed to have established a connection with Rev. Long, who expressed to us on several occasions how much he would love to visit us in Montana. At some point Mike Violett and I had an in-depth conversation about what was going on between our members and Rev. Long. In prayerful discussion we committed everything to Jesus. We were led to believe the only reason Rev. Long should be so heavy on Mike's heart was that the Holy Spirit was speaking to Mike. We asked that God guide Mike and the rest of us in how we should respond.

We discussed how great it would be to bring Rev. Long to speak to our church. Although we prayed about it, we were led to believe the money to pay for a trip from the South Sudan to Montana, even if we could raise it, would be better spent on the needs of the people of South Sudan than on air fares. So, we decided to leave it in God's

hands, rely on the Holy Spirit to guide us—and of course, keep praying.

The Annual Gathering was the perfect opportunity for the Holy Spirit of God to begin a work in us, and I am sure He began a work in many others who attended. We went expecting God would be alive and at work there. He was! He brought Rev. Jordan to our table. He led our conversations and our many meetings and spoke to our hearts. When we returned home, we put Pastor Long on our prayer list. At our quarterly meeting we voted to send support to him. We even discussed bringing Rev. Long to our church to speak, but again reasoned that the money would be better spent helping the people in the refugee camps. We put our faith in God, remained faithful, tried to follow as the Holy Spirit led and kept praying.

In early March I got a phone call from Rev. Chris Miller, pastor of the LCMC Church in Big Fork. That's in the Kalispell area of Montana deep in the Rockies, about five hours from Chester. Rev. Long had not yet returned to Ethiopia—he had been ministering in the Des Moines area. He was going to speak at a gathering of churches in Kalispell. Acting on Rev. Long's request, they wondered if we'd welcome a visit from Rev. Long on March 22. My gaze shot toward heaven and a huge smile broke out on my face as I sat back to listen as Chris described the miracle that was an answer to our prayers.

Although we had no hope of ever seeing Rev. Long again, for reasons we now know was the Holy Spirit of God working in us, we had already discussed how we would organize a visit should one materialize. Such was the desire of our hearts that God send Rev. Long to us.

I immediately told Pastor Chris that not only would we welcome a visit, Rev. Long could stay in a beautiful farm home with Mike & Suzie Violett, members of our congregation. We would meet him on the road or go to Kalispell to pick him up, and deliver him back. We'd feed him, and best of all that Sunday he would enjoy one of our largest days of attendance because that Sunday was



our special Polka service. Rev. Long would be a blessing for us and our Polka service, something I guessed he'd never before experienced. Pastor Chris said he'd get back to me with details, then he and I prayed together before ending our conversation.

I notified Suzie and Mike. We prayed. They contacted Pastor Chris to tell him and they prayed. We exercised patience and kept on praying. Four days before our Polka service, Pastor Chris called to say Rev. Long was coming. We praised God, changed our bulletin for that Sunday and started spreading the word.

On Sunday morning Rev. Long got up early for a 30+ mile drive on dirt and gravel roads and over Tiber Dam to our sister church, St. Olaf, in the middle of mostly unpopulated prairie. There was a traffic jam of



sorts...they had to wait for deer to get off the road. Rev. Long took pictures. At St. Olaf's he was well received by a small but enthusiastic group of worshippers.

From there we made a 40+ mile dash across the prairie and the dam to Our Savior's in Chester. Our Polka service was a great success, as was Rev. Long's presentation. People were very moved by the suffering, political turmoil and needs of refugees in the camps, and by Rev. Long's dedication to God and to the people of the South Sudan. I believe Rev. Long was moved by our appreciation and perhaps astonished by an all Polka worship service. We all enjoyed the fellowship, food, conversation—and of course, Polka!


Everyone agreed it was a miracle! A pastor from the South Sudan in Africa speaking in our two churches



in the middle of Montana's isolated North Central prairie? Impossible! Can't happen, but it did. Why? It was the power of the Holy Spirit of God working in Rev. Long, in our two LCMC prairie churches, in the churches in Kalispell, in our LCMC, and especially at our Annual Gathering in Des Moines.


Our journey with Rev. Long has not ended. He asked that two from our congregation come with him on a missionary trip to Ethiopia. How that goes is in God's hands. We'll keep praying! The point is that wherever this journey goes from here, it began at our LCMC Annual Gathering.

Our journey of experiencing the power of God's Holy Spirit working in us and in those around us to bring about the miracle of having Rev. Long visit us in Montana so we could help the people of South Sudan began at the Annual Gathering. I encourage you to seek God in prayer and let Him lead you to *your* journey.
