# Walking with the Lamb

My family and I have been involved with international Christian work for over 30 years now. We've served in Nepal, Mongolia, and among the Yupik people in SW Alaska. Our home is now in the Pacific Northwest, where I'm serving as a Regional Director for the World Mission Prayer League. My work often takes me to Bangladesh to support our work there.

Many things in mission work have changed over the years. However, using Jesus' example of demonstrating the love of his Father has not changed. He applied the love of God to human need. He healed the sick, fed the hungry, and forgave the repentant. In Bangladesh, I work with LAMB (Lutheran Aid to Medicine in Bangladesh). LAMB is a small hospital by our standards, but the poor come from miles around. The hospital serves a great many mothers and children. About 3,000 children are born in the hospital every year. In addition, the hospital has established 16 healthcare centers in the surrounding Muslim villages. These healthcare centers provide information on hygiene, and programs for children with disabilities. The Muslim leaders in these villages welcome Christian workers

because they cannot deny the silent witness of love they can see.

After so many years of working with international missions I am still compelled to share the message of salvation and hope in a world of people who do not know the name of the Lamb.

As I walk down the street of a crowded Asian city, or sit in a remote village, I see people doing their best to care for families, to live in peace, and to comfort each other in times of suffering. However, they are missing out on the grace of the Lamb in their efforts. They are groping in the dark to find meaning in their lives. To declare that the Lamb is satisfaction for every soul may sound like a brash Christian: whose thinking is too narrow for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Perhaps, but the evidence of the Holy Spirit cannot be denied. He continues to change lives. Those living in darkness, and receive the light of the Lamb are changed people.

The World Mission Prayer League, is a Lutheran mission that has been around for about 50 years. We are a band of peculiar people



in our society. Our operating method is prayer. We send people who have an *unreasonable* commitment to spread the gospel message. Some of our workers are over 70 years old. They work in some of the warmest and coldest places on the earth. They are indeed pouring out the last days of their lives in service of the LAMB. We pray for others to join us in sharing the Lamb with people yearning for a more abundant life.

My family and I are members of St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Rochester, WA. This community of believers pray me though my long travels in Asia. In this way, we walk together in service of the Lamb.

# Workshop being offered in February

Perry Fruhling, LCMC Coordinator for Pastoral Ministry, will present another Conflict Resolution Workshop at Richland Lutheran Church in Richland, Washington.

The Workshop will be from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm on February 22, 2020.

#### The Reality of Conflict

Conflict often results from our seeing things from our own selfish point of view. We confuse being right with doing the right thing. We tend to act out of selfish interests rather than seeking the interest of others (Philippians 2:3).

Like Adam and Eve, we blame others when our relationships fail. But there is hope!

As we learn about how relationships are influenced by broken systems, we can begin to work together to be restored to one another. Once everyone in a conflict takes ownership for their part in the broken relationship, hope begins to flow. As we learn about how to resolve conflict in God honoring ways, we can bring hope to our families, churches, and communities.

The LCMC Conflict Resolution Workshop is designed to help you learn about yourself in conflict as well as steps to forgiveness and reconciliation from a Biblical perspective. The information is based on the work of Murray Bowen, Family Systems therapy, the Iowa Peace Network, and Peacemaker Ministries.

The workshop is fast-moving, hands on, and includes information on:

- Biblical Rationale for Reconciliation
- Understanding Emotional Systems
- Triggers AND Immunity for Anxiety in Congregations
- Triangulation
- Feelings and Anger
- Steps of Conflict Resolution
- Peacemaking Solutions
