BEING A SAFE PLACE

Is it difficult in your congregation to discuss a challenging topic without creating offense, irritation, and hurt feelings?

Mike Bradley, Service Coordinator forMike Bradleythe National LCMC, addressed this

at the Northwest Gathering to "**Grow into becoming a Safe Place**" as we interact with others.

In a nutshell, we were encouraged to be more like Jesus. "Growing in what it means to be a safe place is simply a metaphor designed to help us be more intentional in being transformed and empowered to think, speak, and act more like Jesus; nothing more, nothing less, and nothing else."

Each of us knows someone who takes time to listen, is easy to talk to, is honest, and trusting. Those people are "Safe Places" for us. Mike encouraged everyone to grow into becoming "Safe Places" in becoming more effective as Christ's disciples, both in the public realm as well as within our family and friendship relations.

We will know if we are with a person who is a Safe Place because we can:

 build authentic relationships, ask real questions and get to know Jesus

- take the time to engage in authentic dialogue without rejecting, lecturing or shaming about real doubts and questions
- begin bringing to the surface things hidden from our past that have been hidden out of fear of being judged or condemned
- have the courage to own up to insecurities, pride, and anxieties that we wrestle with
- learn to grow through our failures

Mike Bradley led the Gathering in a 1 hour session but he actually has a 1 day seminar on this topic of growing to become a Safe Place. He is passionate about helping leaders and congregations create an atmosphere that is a safe place for developing healthy leaders and disciples in the church, and equipping God's people for lives of effective witness and ministry in the world.

He is also the author of the book, Being a Safe Place for the Dangerous Kind.

So I left my home of 27 years, my friends, my doctor, my church, and my neighbors and moved to Spokane to live with my son. I must caveat this statement with the fact that one should never move back in with their children, (at least not one in their right mind). However, he says that we are a widower and a widow living together, but that should not define who we are. And so after many challenges, new friends, a new church, a few arguments, and a lot of love, we are, and I am, finally learning how to live together in a new relationship. And also with bunches of God's grace and love, my life in Him and from Him, slowly started to come back.

I also finally found myself wanting to reconnect with old acquaintances and old relationships. I decided to attend the Northwest District Annual Gathering at Camp Lutherhaven in Mid-May. What an awesome joy to once again connect with old friends, and make new ones. I found my child-like faith returning. I found the excitement of enjoyable fellowship. I met new friends, smiled and found my "happy" once again. I laughed, smiled, talked too much and probably told too many stories. I learned how not to expect anything less than all that God wants to give me.

I was wonderfully excited by the number of young pastors and their families that were there. Pastors that I truly believe are the future of our faith and our religion, our churches, and our fellowship of believers in the Northwest District. Their true enthusiasm and the energy they exhibited was contagious and amazing. God bless those people that raised up these young leaders in such a wonderful way. My all of us, and I mean "ALL" of us choose to do the same. I pray that we should always be on the look-out for our young men and women and maybe those "not so young" who may be called to serve our Lord with their talents and love of God. I challenge us to be the eyes and ears of our Lord and copy the heart of God to raise them up in support.
