Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ!

One of my favorite Bible stories is of Jesus standing on the shoreline. He meets Peter in his boat as he comes in from a long night of catching nothing. Jesus tells Peter to go out deeper and cast his nets. In the movie "Son Of God" the actor who plays Jesus wades out into the water and asks Peter to help him. Peter acknowledges and pulls Jesus in. They go out together and Peter asks, "What shall we do? I have fished all night and there is nothing." Jesus says, "Go out deeper and cast your nets". We are beyond excited to host the annual NW District LCMC conference in our wonderful city!

Great Falls, also known as The Electric City, is nick-named after our dams which are scattered along the mighty Missouri River. Our city has much to offer our guests!

Our population is around 55,000 with 5,000 being members of the Air Force and Air National Guard. We are located on the historic Lewis & Clark Trail and have a wonderful interpretive center. Great Falls is home to several museums including the History Museum; the Charlie Russell Western Art Museum; the Paris Gibson Museum of Contemporary Art; the Malmstrom Air Force Base Museum; and the Children's Museum of Montana. If you like to walk or bike, we have over 55 miles of paved Rivers Edge Trail and several beautiful parks. If you like to shop, our historic downtown offers unique clothing boutiques, as well as a candy store, toy store, tea shop, specialty kitchen store, Western Shop, and numerous coffee shops and restaurants.

Great Falls is centrally located with its own international airport which makes it the ideal gateway for your Montana experience. We are only 2.5 hours from Glacier National Park. Unfortunately, the park will not be open in May but that doesn't mean there isn't plenty to do in the area! We are approximately 4.5 hours from Yellowstone National Park and only an hour's drive to several mountain ranges if you enjoy hiking and camping!

For the NW LCMC Annual Gathering, we have reserved a block of rooms at the Heritage Inn, based on a first come first serve reservation (use special event code: Northwest district LCMC). There are also many other alternative lodging options including: the Hampton Inn; the Hilton Garden Inn; the Holiday Inn; the Lewis & Clark O'Haire Motor Inn and the historic Hotel Arvon, which are both located downtown. Hotel Arvon is attached to an Irish Pub while the O'Haire Motor Inn is world famous for their mermaids. Yep, you heard correctly, mermaids!

Again, we can't wait to see you all in May!



Being an interim pastor in Eastern Washington was not something I ever planned to do. It had never been my intention or my childhood dream to even be a pastor! I was born and raised in Guatemala City. Both my parents were pastors and founded the Augustinian Lutheran Church of Guatemala in 1991. My plan was to support the ministry of the church in any way I could as I pursued my dreams to become an entrepreneur or a lawyer but never a pastor. But, as you might relate, God not only has plans for His children but also has a sense of humor even when we might not find it very humorous. I was trained by my father and ordained into Word and Sacrament Ministry in the Lutheran Church of Guatemala, and as I began my ministry in 2004, I also met my future wife. Amanda had graduated from Luther Seminary and she was the recipient of the Preaching Fellowship which is granted to one graduating student every year. We met and one year and six months later we were married. God has blessed us with two wonderful children, Abigail (13) and Joaquin (10).

Amanda was ordained into Word and Sacrament Ministry in 2007 in the Guatemalan Lutheran Church. God called us to serve the Lutheran Church of Guatemala together for ten years. In addition to serving two churches in Guatemala City on a regular basis, we also pastured 15 other churches throughout the country along with a pastoral team. We became part of the seminary faculty training lay leaders and pastors to equip them to serve more effectively the growing church in the different rural regions of Guatemala. We moved to Minnesota, Amanda's home state, in 2013. We settled in the Twin Cities for six and a half years, serving in separate churches while we lived there. As I had never served a church in the United States, I attended Luther Seminary while also serving as an associate pastor at a church north of the Twin Cities. At Luther, I pursued and obtained my M.A. in Systematic Theology in 2016. At the end of 2017, God blessed us with a call to serve as part of the teaching faculty at St. Paul Lutheran Seminary for the international program and we have been enjoying it ever since.

In 2019, God called us to the state of Washington when my wife accepted a call to Creator Luther-an Church. We moved trusting God would provide me with a call in Word and Sacrament Ministry. Since then I have covered pulpit supply in Western Washington where we live. During the week, I work at a non-profit in Enumclaw, and I have been serving as the interim pastor at United Lutheran Church in Water-ville, WA every Sunday since September of 2021. When the passes are not closed due to snow storms I am there in person, and if travel becomes challenging due to the weather, technology allows for remote connection. In his faithfulness to His children our good Lord provides communities of faith and in May 2021 I was invited to attend the NW District's Annual Gathering. As a result, a few months later, I was blessed to be received as an individual member of this District and later a member of the District's Council. I rejoice in God's faithfulness as I continue to be drawn to be part of the LCMC in different capacities and roles. God is indeed good and blesses us richly when we least expect it! I look forward to continuing to get to know more of you and to serve in the District in any way that is needed.
