"The Call"

Almost every question for consultation concerning our LCMC congregations recently has been about "the call". Specifically, we are talking about the process of calling a pastor to the local congregation. The first inquiry is usually, "Does the LCMC have enough pastors to fill the pulpits?" Decidedly, yes, if we are only relying on mathematics. There are more pastors than congregations. Yet, the solution is not that simple.

This call is not issued through arithmetic, rather it consists of several parts. To oversimplify it we could ask two questions to begin the discussion: Who calls the pastor? What is the pastor called to? Starting with the first, the answer needs to be in two parts. This is because the call of a pastor is both inward and outward. Pastors are called both by the Holy Spirit and the local congregation. Considering what pastors are called to then would be the proper distribution of Word and Sacrament. Every congregation would benefit from having a conversation about what the call to their church is, but also what is the call that God has placed on each of us.

The LCMC gives freedom here. A congregation can call any person they wish for this ministry to them. Even you may be asked to step to proclaim the Good News one Sunday morning. Yet, we do not want to rush in as fools do. We know that it is good for a person to be educated and examined before serving others in ordination. This is what we often call the certification process. Others are called by contract. Both are distinct from ordination but connected. The difference here though is not in the validity of the call, but instead the qualifications of each candidate and the means they are called by. The distinction we have made is for the purpose of clarity and transparency so that congregations have firmer grasp of who they are calling. "There is no legitimate or ordinary call to the ministry except from God..." Martin Chemnitz lists five reasons in his book *Ministry, Word, and Sacrament: An Enchiridion* for why we must treat this topic with all seriousness and sincerity:

- 1. Because God Himself deals with us in the church through the ministry as through the ordinary means and instrument. For it is He Himself that speaks, exhorts, absolves, baptizes, etc.
- **2.** Very many and necessary gifts are required for ministry.
- **3.** The chief thing of the ministry is that God wants to be present in it with His Spirit, grace, and gifts to work effectively through it.
- **4.** The assurance of divine call stirs up ministers of the Word, so that each one, in his or her station, in the fear of God, performs his or her functions with greater faith, diligence, and eagerness, without weariness.
- **5.** Finally, on the basis of the hearers are stirred up to true reverence and obedience toward the ministry...

What, then, is the office or work of the ministry of the church? Chemnitz goes on to conclude about the call by saying, "The office of a minister of the church therefore is, that he diligently study the Holy Scriptures and give himself to reading them, moreover that he labor in Word and doctrine, that he feed the flock of Christ and the church of God, that is, he is to serve the church with the preaching of the Word and administration of the Sacraments and use of the keys." Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore, pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." + Matthew 9:37-38

Meet Our Newest Member!

Trinity Lutheran Church – Lewiston, Idaho





Trinity Lutheran Church is located in the heart of Lewiston, Idaho. While the organization of Trinity Lutheran Church was not completed until May 1920, the history of Lutheran church work in Lewiston goes back as far as 1907. In 1926, Trinity Lutheran Church members of the former Zion Lutheran church transferred to Trinity and the former Zion church was purchased. The present sanctuary and the east wing were built and dedicated on June 20, 1948. In 1956 the west wing was added to the church, containing twelve classrooms, three assembly rooms, and two offices.

In the 2010/2011 timeframe, Trinity Lutheran Church left the ELCA and joined the NALC and chose to dual roster with the LCMC in 2021. We praise God that the transition went smoothly.

We seek to be God's hands and feet. One of our many long-standing ministries is our Trinity Lutheran Preschool which has served Lewiston for more than 50 years. Members of our congregation are actively involved with Valley Meals On Wheels, the Community Action Partnership Food Bank and Habitat for Humanity and we prepare meals for the Salvation Army Soup Kitchen and the Snake River Medical Clinic. We are grateful for our ongoing relationship with all these ministry partners. In 2010, we launched our Family Promise Shelter program opening our church facility to support temporary housing programs for adults with children who are working to find employment and permanent housing solutions.

In June 2020, we surpassed the century mark. Due to COVID, we were unable to celebrate but we are looking forward to a belated church anniversary celebration on Trinity Sunday of 2023.

On June 1, Pastor Donna Zipp was called to serve the congregation and was installed on June 26, 2022. Pastor Donna and Rodney, along with the congregation of Trinity give thanks to God for His past provision and look forward to serving Him together into the future!
