Meet Our Newest Northwest Mission Start - Tahoma Lutheran Church



About a year and a half ago, my husband and I resigned our respective calls. Like many pastors who have resigned or retired, or simply left the ministry altogether in the past two or three years, this was partly having to do with the pandemic and the way in which we responded to it. However, there were also unacknowledged internal church troubles, particular to our congregation, for which the pandemic provided an opportune time for matters to fester and flourish. We resigned without a call-in-hand to any other church.

Over the next several months we participated in online and in-person worship services in our local vicinity. Eventually, we started meeting with another family a couple times a month for dinner at each other's homes or at our neighborhood pub. They, too, had become Lutherans without a church. We met to talk theology, read scripture, and to hear each other's confessions and give each other the absolution. Forgiveness among friends is a blessed gift from Christ. This is the gospel through the conversation and consolation of Christians that Luther's *Smalcald Articles* mentions.

In January of 2022, it became clear to us that the Holy Spirit had started to gather an embryonic house church amongst our families in our little neighborhood in Maple Valley, WA. While there are several other Lutheran churches in our city, there were no LCMC congregations. That is, until the Holy Spirit raised a few of his forgiven sinners out of the ashes and rubble of sin and death of the pandemic. Tahoma Lutheran Church was established to strengthen and nourish the faith which was first given us in baptism through the weekly preaching of the Word and sacraments. Our first worship service was conducted at a member's house with 11 people between three families.

Why the name Tahoma Lutheran Church? Our families are rooted in densely populated neighborhoods filled with sinners of all ages in need of the hearing of the forgiveness of their sins in Christ Jesus. TLC meets in a house deep in a neighborhood of Maple Valley from where Mt. Rainier is visible to the south when the cloak of clouds unfurls from its granite dome for a few months of the year. Mt. Rainier previously bore the Native American Indian name, Tahoma, which means "that frozen

Mt. Rainier previously bore the Native American Indian name, Tahoma, which means "that frozen water" and is a name used commonly in our city. For example, Tahoma High School is the city's sole and very large (2,700+ students) high school where the church's children either already attend or will in a few short years. Our school district is also called Tahoma. It seemed more than appropriate to name this new congregation Tahoma Lutheran Church.

We have much to be thankful for and much to pray for at Tahoma Lutheran Church, but we have the main thing: the pure preaching of the gospel of Jesus Christ and the right administration of the sacraments by which the Holy Spirit is calling, gathering, enlightening, and sanctifying sinners in Maple Valley in our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. *Soli Deo gloria*.

Greg Finke is the founder and Executive Director of Dwelling 1:14 and author of books, *Joining Jesus on His Mission: How to Be an Everyday Missionary* and, *Joining Jesus – Show Me How: How to Disciple Everyday Missionaries*. Dwelling 1:14 is a non-profit ministry which helps leaders disciple people to join Jesus on his mission in the places they already live, work and go to school.

The name Dwelling 1:14 refers to John 1:14 and the incarnational, missional nature both of Jesus and those who would follow him into the world. Greg offers consulting and training experiences for congregations and their leaders in discipling, living missionally, and multiplying missional community environments.

Greg will be delivering a series of keynote sessions throughout the course of our *Come Follow Me* gathering. Often times people simply look at the cross through the lens of personal salvation and live life primarily on the sidelines of God's activity in the world. But Greg will show us how Jesus' atoning sacrifice on the cross not only saves us, but also gives us a mission and compels us to live on the frontlines of God's Kingdom building activity in our own communities. Using a scriptural foundation, Greg will educate and inspire us toward an exciting new way of living as everyday missionaries in our local communities.

Greg is a graduate of Concordia University, Chicago and Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. Before founding Dwelling 1:14, he served as pastor of two congregations in Michigan and Texas for 21 years. Greg and his wife, Susan, have three daughters and enjoyed life as neighborhood missionaries in League City, Texas before God's call to begin Dwelling 1:14.

I have a challenge for you. During these next few months until we reunite once again at beautiful **Camp Lutherhaven** on **Lake Coeur D'Alene**, to be sure and check out Greg's Blog and the Dwelling 1:14 website.
