Northwest District Annual Gathering 2023

Amid the towering pines and the aromas of conifer, lake and food, approximately 104 people were present for a weekend of activity at Lutherhaven. The setting provided a restful yet invigorating atmosphere for our Annual Northwest District Gathering, May 19 - 21.

Our Guest Speaker, Pastor Julie Smith brought us up to speed on the continuing mission of LCMC; changes in leadership positions, availability of pastors, and a "new wave" of congregations joining with LCMC. We are a church which continues to preach, reach and teach the uncompromising truth of the Word of God rather than formulating social statements. God's Word is our unchanging authority upon which we stand. Pastor Julie always has pertinent information for us and a challenge, comfort and hope for our future. There have been many changes in society and the church since the COVID lockdowns took place, but God's Word remains constant and true – for all generations.

Our keynote presenter, Rev. Greg Finke, and his wife, Susan - cofounders of **dwelling 1:14** - "tag teamed" a delightful journey through a MISSION ROAD MAP. It's all about Mission, Discipleship & Multiplication. The model is Jesus' own: **Tell Me How** = Hearing the teachings of Jesus; **Show Me How** = Seeing the way Jesus lived out His teachings for the good of others so I can imitate Him; **Show Others How** = Show others how to do the same.

Greg and Susan presented practical ways to join Jesus in His mission; fielding five core questions to encourage reflection and conversation during the day and throughout the week. This process involves one's own relationship with Jesus; joining Jesus in His ministry. Then, the natural progress would be to filter those experiences into everyday encounters with "pre-Christian" friends – especially within your neighborhood.

We praised our Lord Jesus in worship and evening campfires. We celebrated fellowship, encouragement and ideas; exchanging information and wisdom with friends old and new through meals, private and group "huddles" that popped up here and there.

The work of the District (our business meeting) had several highlights; celebrating milestones, looking back over the past year, vision casting our goals and the election of (and not so new) Council members. We welcome Grant Crichton and Marney Fritts to the board, and Carol Ann Buelow agreed to return for her 2nd term. We are excited about our future as the "new" Council continues the work and ministry with our district. There is an atmosphere of joy and a "let's get to work and get it done" attitude.

Our District initially passed a change in our Bylaws (which will need the approval of a majority of our member congregations before next year's Gathering), and we approved continuing our Congregations Family Album and establishing a District Scrapbook.
