

In May 2011, future members of Grace Community Lutheran Church left an ELCA congregation in La Grande, Oregon. They agreed to pray, study and research future plans. After a couple of months, 30 committed "founders" met to establish a new church under

LCMC. A Constitution and Bylaws were written and approved. A historic vacant church was rented. A search for a more permanent facility found a small congregation in tiny Cove, OR, willing to share their facility with them, beginning in December 2011.

In May 2012, Grace called, ordained and installed its first pastor. We see ourselves as a "royal priesthood of believers" and "called to serve", which is our mission. We are filling a niche to minister to the poor, the rural and un-churched. Our prayers for growth are being answered. Patience is difficult, but we see that being rewarded as we plant seeds.

We have adjusted the traditional Lutheran worship service to accommodate varying levels of Christian understanding. Our members are from various backgrounds, needing a gentle approach for our worship service and education efforts. During Bible studies we acknowledge the Lutheran perspective.

Our congregation is healthy, growing and enjoying our fellowship together. We are financially stable and unafraid to experiment with new missions. A community Bible study and breakfast for men meets weekly. Sunday Bible classes for adults and children and 12 mission projects are underway. Community basketball clinics have been conducted.

Grace had no building of its own, but had a strong desire for Biblical worship and for sharing the Gospel. We had no permanent minister, but had many dedicated people from Oregon and Washington willing to furnish our pastoral needs. Small churches take heed—with God's help, establishing a new church can be done joyously!
