

- Moe Bessey has agreed to serve as an Interim District Coordinator for a one-year period.





### Karla Kaleva - NW District Treasurer





Jonathan (Neesha), who works as a pharmacist. He is very excited about working with the NW District Board of Directors.


## Church Spotlight - Zion Lutheran Church - Kent, WA



Zion Lutheran Church has been a part of the growing and diverse community of Kent, WA, in the beautiful Pacific Northwest since 1903. In the early years of the church, the practice of worship was very much like the "home churches" from which the founding members had emigrated – with men and boys seated on one side, and women and girls on the other side. Services were conducted in Norwegian until 1921, when there was a change to holding services in English and Norwegian on alternating Sundays. The original little white church was built in 1946, and that building is currently the home of

Sunshine Mountain Christian Preschool and Kindergarten, which was founded in 1979. A new church building was dedicated in 1967, to which a separate education building was added in 1994. We are currently blessed to have over 320 members, and many wonderful opportunities for all ages.

In its over 100-year history, Zion Lutheran has experienced many changes not only in the East Hill community of Kent, but also in the life of the congregation itself. We've taken time over the last couple of years to consider the direction of Zion's ministry through prayer and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Our current mission statement declares that "In Jesus Christ, we REJOICE in God's grace, RENEW through God's Word, and REACH OUT to serve others all to the glory of God." In the most recent change, after two years without a pastor, Zion Lutheran called Pastor Kelly Westlund, who began ministry here in November of 2023. Pastor Kelly finished her MDiv studies at Fuller Theological Seminary in March, and we recently celebrated her installation at Zion Lutheran on April 27, 2024. We eagerly look forward to all that God has planned for Zion Lutheran Church in the future!
