

2025 Annual Gathering Northwest District of LCMC

May 1-3, 2025

The 2025 Annual Gathering for the Northwest District of LCMC (*NW District*) will take place over three days from May 1st to May 3rd. Information on the gathering can be found below.

Gathering Theme

"What's the Story? - Romans 5:8"

"But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." – (Romans 5:8)

Romans 5:8 is a beautiful and powerful reminder of God's unconditional love. It speaks of a love that doesn't wait for us to be perfect, worthy, or "good enough." Instead, it meets us right where we are—in the depths of our sin, brokenness, and imperfections.

Pastors Jon Anderson and Dave Hall, our keynote speakers, will unpack the facets of this spiritual gem.

We have partnered with Peace Lutheran Church of Belgrade, MT, in convening our annual gathering this year. Members of Peace's worship band will provide accompaniment for times of praise and worship. Karla Kaleva will lead our district mass choir. The choir will provide special music during closing worship. All those called to sing in the choir will practice on Saturday morning.

Pastor Andrew Young will welcome us and shepherd us through the weekend. He will also preach and preside at closing worship.

For those who are flying in, Peace Lutheran has also graciously offered to



provide transportation from the Bozeman Yellowstone International Airport in Bozeman to the Camp and then return you to the airport. Carpooling will be available during the weekend for various purposes. Pastor Julie Smith, Coordinator for Districts and



Fellowships of LCMC, will lead us in the opening Bible Study on Titus 3:4-8a and will update us on all that is new at LCMC.

Julie Smith is a life-long Lutheran and became a pastor in 1998. She has served congregations in

Clarkfield, Bock, and Springfield (all in Minnesota). In addition, she served for several years as a Bible camp director. She is also a co-founder of St. Paul Lutheran Seminary

Delegates and visitors will get a chance to talk about how their congregations embody our theme in a townhall session on Saturday.

We will also hear presentations from two local faithbased charities, Love Inc., and ZoeCare. ZoeCare has been designated as the recipient of offerings from our closing worship service. Delegates and visitors can support Love Inc., through donations of products. These tangible offerings will be presented to representatives of Love Inc., on Saturday.

Our Venue

Yellowstone Alliance Adventures Camp



District's gathering will be convened at Yellowstone Alliance Adventures Camp and Christian Retreat Center 13707 Cottonwood Canyon Rd, Bozeman, MT 59718, USA (the *Camp*). The Camp is located about 13 miles from Bozeman's city center and 19 miles from the Holiday Inn. It takes 20 minutes to drive from the city center to the camp due to the posted speed limit and the rural character of the road.

Gathering Spaces



All meetings, keynote presentations, and worship services will be held in the Camp's chapel building. It seats 120.

The Camp's amenities include a game room, yard games such as cornhole, Kubb, ladder toss, hiking trails, volleyball courts and other activities. There will be plenty to do during the scheduled free time.

Meals



All meals from Thursday night to Sunday morning will be provided by the Camp and will be served in the Camp's Dining Hall. Their meals are described as delicious and generous! Their breads, rolls, and desserts are baked fresh right in the kitchen, and most meals are made from scratch! The kitchen and dining room are cozy and welcoming.



If you are flying into Bozeman-Yellowstone International Airport of Bozeman, MT, Peace Lutheran will arrange transportation from the airport to the Camp and back to the airport. Carpooling will be available during the weekend for various purposes.

Unique opportunity

Not only can delegates and visitors come together for an amazing weekend of worship, fellowship, and inspiration, our annual gathering will be held in one of the most picturesque areas in the US.

Bozemen is located about 80 miles north of Yellowstone National Park. The drive from Bozeman to North Yellowstone is about a 1 hour 30 minute drive via US-89 S. As the North Entrance is the only entrance open year-round, it's one of the most popular routes from Bozeman to Yellowstone. The drive is an ideal prelude to the marvels that lie ahead.

Mammoth Hot springs is the first point of interest encountered after entering the North Entrance. Park headquarters, other sights and Old Faithful are found further south. The Grand Teton National Park is just south of Yellowstone National Park. The area is noted for breathtaking scenery, hiking and whitewater rafting.



Bozeman itself has a world-renowned Dinosaur Museum, Planetarium, and great shopping. Historic Virginia City and Nevada City also are close by. What an opportunity to add a couple of days of sightseeing to a weekend spent with brothers and sisters in Christ.



Accommodations

Accommodation will be available at the Camp, and at the Holiday Inn and in Belgrade (about 19 miles from the Camp).

Accommodations at the Camp

There are three lodges with 4 rooms in each lodge and RV spaces.

#1 Upper Canyon Lodge:

- Upper Canyon Lodge
- Fully accommodated with bathrooms and showers
- 4 rooms (1 -2 bunks & 1 queen bed)
- Handicap accessible



#2 Lower Canyon Lodge:

- Fully accommodated with bathrooms and showers
- 4 rooms (2 rooms have a queen bed and bunks & 2 rooms have 4 bunks)
- Handicap accessible



#3 Bunkhouse:

- Fully accommodated with bathrooms and showers
- 4 rooms 12-14 people/room (5 or 6 bunks)
- Handicap accessible



Guests must bring their own bedding (linens) and towels.

Linens: Bring your own.
